

Cherished brother of the late Lucille Flynn and her late husband John. Stepfather of Dennis Latham and his wife Patricia of Gloucester, Denise Ekborg and her husband Dennis of St. Johnsbury, VT. Loving "Grampy" of 20 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. Also survived by many loving nieces, nephews, in-laws and friends. Charles was a former newspaper editor, public relations executive, and parking lot proprietor. He attended Boston Public Schools, Newman Preparatory School, University of Missouri and graduated from Suffolk University. He volunteered to service in the U.S. Submarine Service in WWII. His submarine, the U.S.S. Flounder, sank the U-537, a German U-Boat in the Pacific. Laubenstein started his newspaper career as an office boy at the Boston Record-American. He also worked on the staff of the Cape Cod Standard Times, Worcester Telegram, Brockton Enterprise, Boston Traveler and the Boston Herald. He started Owl Public Relations in 1960. Among his clients were the Boston Carmen's Union, Local 25 Teamsters Union, Cambridge Municipal Worker's Union and many political figures and organizations. He also worked for the Boston Red Sox for 67 years, as well as The Boston Braves, New England Patriots, Boston College, Harvard University as an usher and ticket taker. Laubenstein was a sustaining member of the Republican National Committee and the Massachusetts Republican Party. He was past Vice President of the Boston Republican Committee and Chairman of Hyde Park Ward 18 and Gloucester Ward 4 Republican Committee. He was Republican Candidate for Governor's Council from Hyde Park in 1972. Appointed to the Mass Bicentennial Commission in 1974, he formed the recreated British Fifth Regiment of Foot. The group took part in many recreated battles and events of the Revolutionary War in 6 states. The
