Helen McGowan Morgan of Hyde Park and Milton died on July 17, 2016 at The German Centre for Extended Care in West Roxbury at the age of 96 years after a short illness.

Even after she stopped doing jigsaw puzzles, she continued to beat all opponents at Scrabble and enjoyed playing Connect Four with Donnie.
