Bea's charms were soon claimed once again when she married Tony Crescenzi of East Syracuse in October, 1986. Bea and Tony created a new home where family gathered for Tony's cookouts. She and Tony took a long and exciting trip to Italy to meet Tony's family and they also took a number of memorable cruises. Bea enjoyed collecting souvenirs from their trips.
