He was known for his performances with the Irish Tabernacle Choir, the Blarney Stones, and the church choir. A.P. bowled in a couple's league and men's bowling league, still going at age 88. One of A.P.'s greatest passions was music. He hummed, whistled, sang, and played guitar. He could dance a mean polka and taught all his daughters and grand-daughters how to waltz. A.P. accepted every person as they were, had the ability to see the best in each, and always had time to help or give advice.
