He and Mariaha loved going to dinner, taking drives, going on bike rides, listening to 50s music, playing games together (Rummikub was his favorite), and working in his shop. He would often teach Mariaha his love for woodwork and she loved helping him.

To his family and numerous friends, Poochie was known for wearing a smile around town, waving, and giving a "Hey there". He was a father, son, brother, uncle, and friend who is loved and will be missed forever.
